The sheer scale of alarming facts around data security speak volumes about the importance of this work continuing:

- "93% of DPA breaches are caused by human error" ICO 2015
- "90% of data has been created in the last two years"
- "Failure to protect EU residents data could result in penalties up to E20million or 4% of turnover" **EU GDPR**
- "Cyber security breaches for SMEs now cost as much as £310,800 (up from £115,000 in 2014)" Dept for Business Innovation & Skills Information Security Breaches Survey, June 2015

Director of Technology, Security & Governance, **JP Norman** commented: "The potential for a cyber attack to disrupt a company is now greater than ever. As firms look to expand their network with mobile connectivity, cloud services and the Internet of Things, they also increase the possible points of infiltration for hackers.

This risk, **JP Norman** says, is added to by the misconception of many businesses that their organisations are of little interest to a hacker. "This is simply not true" he adds, "Cyber targeting is not necessarily about the size of a company or having a high profile brand name. Some of the greatest breaches have occurred because of companies being part of the supply chain to other larger businesses – and that is how the hackers have got in".

JP Norman's advice is simple: "Whoever you are, whatever your business, or size – you have to take steps to review your security policies and plan and test your security systems".
